Park Buildings – Facility Information

- Six Park Buildings were constructed in 2015 and 2016 at Autumn Grove, Lexington, Rosebrook, Oasis, Sandcastle, and Villa Park
- Similar events/usage as Cedarholm Community Building

Staff emphasized that the Cedarholm Golf Course and Community Building offer a wide range of recreational opportunities beyond golf, including community events and facility rentals. They also noted that golf is a lifetime sport that can be enjoyed at Cedarholm by both experienced and inexperienced players.

Chair Matts-Benson asked whether adult golf lessons have ever been considered. Staff responded that adult lessons have been offered in the past; however, due to the abundance of hands-on learning opportunities already available within the community, formal teaching programs have not been offered recently, as there has not been a strong demand.

Commissioner Penny inquired about environmental planning for the golf course, noting that golf courses are often perceived as environmentally detrimental. Staff explained that Cedarholm’s environmental impact is continually monitored and addressed. Recent efforts include the use of organic chemicals, the planting of native plants and trees, and careful review of all tree removals, with replacements planted when necessary. Additionally, irrigation practices are intentionally timed and managed to minimize environmental impact.

160 Commissioner Kooistra asked about the use of volunteers at Cedarholm. Staff responded that
161 volunteers play an important role in supporting both golf course operations and community
162 events, they are used whenever possible to help ensure everything runs smoothly. Commissioner
163 Kooistra suggested adding a question for golf course users or facility renters to gauge their
164 willingness to volunteer in the future, to encourage greater volunteer engagement among
165 participants.

166
167 Commissioner Kooistra asked about the potential to use winter trails for additional activities,
168 such as fat-tire biking. Staff responded that they are continually exploring ways to increase usage
169 of the course during non-golf months, while ensuring that any activities do not cause damage to
170 the turf.

171
172 Commissioner Botzek expressed how much she enjoys golfing at Cedarholm and praised both
173 the quality of the course and the community building. She also commended the staff for the
174 excellent job they do in maintaining and managing the facilities.

175
176 **b) CITY OF ROSEVILLE STRATEGIC PLAN UPDATE**

177 Staff reiterated the importance of the City's Strategic Plan in ensuring that everyone is working
178 toward agreed-upon, shared goals. They noted that the City Council recently adopted 21 goals
179 along with corresponding community aspirations and success indicators. Staff highlighted
180 several of the goals, community aspirations, and success indicators that directly relate to the
181 work of the Parks and Recreation Commission:

182
183 **Reliable and Sustainable Infrastructure**

- 184 • Goal #1 – Develop and implement a strategic funding strategy that prioritizes key capital
185 improvements that are planned, regularly assessed and evolve based on city values and
186 changing community needs.
- 187 • Goal #2 – Implement the civic master plan on time, within budget, and with community
188 input.
- 189 • Goal #3 – city infrastructure supports the sustainability goals of the city.

190 **Parks and Natural Environment**

- 191 • Goal #1 – Parks and natural resources are preserved, maintained and enhanced to ensure
192 a broad cross-section of community members actively use and participate in our parks,
193 activities and facilities.
- 194 • Goal #2 – Roseville's natural environment is actively protected and restored.

195
196 Next steps include sub-groups of staff members working to translate the adopted goals,
197 community aspirations, and success indicators into tangible, measurable objectives. These
198 objectives will help prioritize actions and ensure that future decisions align with and support the
199 City's established goals.

200 The Commission expressed appreciation for the emphasis on, and inclusion of, specific goals
201 related to parks. They also discussed how the success indicators and objectives would be
202 measured, and who would be responsible for tracking and evaluating them.
203

204 Finally, the Commission discussed recent projects in which staff partnered with volunteers to
205 complete work that directly reflected the values and goals outlined in the Strategic Plan. They
206 also considered how the Parks and Recreation Department can use these goals to further support
207 and advance community aspirations.
208

209 **c) MAINTENANCE AND OPERATIONS CENTER UPDATE**

210 The preliminary assessment of the space, conducted through a feasibility study by BKV Group,
211 has been completed and will be presented to the City Council on June 2. Staff noted that they
212 will remind the Commission about the presentation once the details of the City Council meeting
213 are confirmed.
214

215 **d) PREPARE FOR PARK TOURS FOR JUNE 3, 2025 MEETING**

216 The next Parks and Recreation Commission meeting will begin at City Hall and then proceed
217 with site visits to Reservoir Woods Park and Autumn Grove Park. Additional sites may be toured
218 if time permits. Staff recommended that attendees wear comfortable walking shoes. The
219 Commission also discussed the possibility of wearing their Parks and Recreation Commissioner
220 shirts for the site visits.
221

222 **5. OTHER BUSINESS**

223 **a) DEPARTMENTAL UPDATES**

- 224 • The Lexington Park Playground Build event had 30 volunteers who participated in
225 constructing the new playground. Additional construction elements are expected to be
226 completed soon in preparation for the opening on June 1. Staff expressed gratitude to For
227 Parks for their \$75,000 donation, as well as to all the volunteers and Parkway Pizza for their
228 generous contributions of time and food.
- 229 • The Roseville Ice Show was held April 10-12, 2025, featuring three performances. The event
230 included 225 participants and sold a total of 2,700 tickets.
231 The Roseville Dance Recital was held on May 3 and 4 at the new Roseville High School
232 Auditorium. The event featured 102 dancers, one dress rehearsal, and two performances,
233 drawing a total audience of 760 attendees. Staff thanked all the volunteers and dancers who
234 made the event possible. Chair Matts-Benson noted that the Roseville School of Dance
235 classes provide highly accessible, affordable, and equitable dance classes.
- 236 • The Kite Day in the Park event was held on April 26 at Rosebrook Park, where 300 free kites
237 were distributed. Special thanks were given to Kiwanis Malt Shop at the MN State Fair and
238 Do Good Roseville for generously donating the kites for the event.

- 239 • The Earth Day event was held on April 26 at the Harriet Alexander Nature Center, drawing
240 approximately 750 attendees.
- 241 • In April, volunteers contributed over 1,100 hours of service throughout the park system.
242 Projects included cleaning up Central Park, cutting buckthorn at Langton Lake Park, and
243 trash pickup efforts led by corporate, scout, and civic groups. Staff gave a special thank you
244 to Roseville’s Volunteer Manager, Rachel Boggs, for coordinating with volunteer groups, as
245 well as to all the volunteers who helped keep the parks looking their best.
- 246 • The FOR Parks Designer Handbag Bingo event will be held on May 10 at the Cedarholm
247 Community Building.
- 248 • The Flower Power volunteer event is scheduled for May 17. Flowers for the event are
249 generously donated by FOR Parks. Those interested in volunteering can contact Rachel
250 Boggs at Rachel.boggs@cityofroseville.com.
- 251 • The Roseville Figure Skating Championships will take place on May 17.
- 252 • The citywide Community Garage Sale will take place on May 29–31.
- 253 • Staff recently testified at the Minnesota State Legislature in support of including the MN
254 OVAL bonding request in this year’s bonding bill. They are seeking \$1.2 million in
255 additional funding to complete the proposed skating center renovations that were originally
256 introduced in 2020.
- 257 • Staff noted that they will be sending out the sign-up sheet for Commissioners to register for
258 the Discover Your Parks events.
- 259 • Rosefest 2025 will be held on June 23-29.

260
261 **b) OTHER NEW OR RELEVANT COMMUNICATION ITEMS**

262 The Commission discussed a suggestion received about potentially focusing resources on a few
263 larger parks rather than maintaining many smaller community parks/playgrounds. In response,
264 the Commission emphasized the importance of having numerous parks that are easily accessible
265 to all community members, highlighting equity and neighborhood-level access as key priorities.
266

267 Chair Matts-Benson suggested creating educational communications to help the community
268 understand the City’s Park "constellations" and the rationale behind the distribution of parks
269 throughout Roseville.
270

271 Staff noted that all public feedback received is acknowledged with a response from staff and is
272 included in the next Commission meeting packet.
273

274 Commissioner Kooistra suggested that the Commission could consider discussing park building
275 color schemes if the topic arises in the future.
276

Autumn Grove Park is a 10-acre park that hosts a wide range of recreational programs and is used for a broad cross-section of activities. The south parcel was added in 2013 and is largely undeveloped. The north portion includes ball fields, soccer space, a seasonal ice rink, a park building, and basketball and tennis courts. In 2018, a volunteer-built and managed pump track was added to the south parcel. In the coming years, the Autumn Grove Park playground is on the Capital Improvement Program.
