



Regular City Council Meeting Minutes
City Hall Council Chambers, 2660 Civic Center Drive
Monday, April 13, 2026

1. Roll Call

Mayor Roe called the meeting to order at approximately 6:24 p.m. Voting and Seating Order: Groff, Bauer, Strahan, Schroeder, and Roe. City Manager Patrick Trudgeon and City Attorney Rachel Tierney were also present.

2. Pledge of Allegiance

3. Approve Agenda

Groff moved, Strahan seconded, approval of the agenda as presented.

Roll Call

4. Public Comment

Mayor Roe called for public comment by audience members on non-agenda items.

Mr. Mark Bourne introduced himself as the Republican candidate for the Minnesota House of Representatives for District 66A, which includes the area south of Highway 36. He indicated that if elected, he hopes to serve as Roseville's first point of contact for any issues requiring state assistance or action, regardless of which side of Highway 36 is involved. Bourne added that he is willing to help community members with state-related concerns and encouraged everyone to vote.

Mayor Roe thanked Mr. Bourne for his comments.

5. Recognitions, Donations, and Communications

a. Proclaim Asian American and Pacific Islander Heritage Month

Mayor Roe read the Asian American and Pacific Islander Month Proclamation.

Groff moved, Schroeder seconded, proclaiming May 2026, Asian American and Pacific Islander Heritage Month.

Groff expressed appreciation for the work completed by the Equity and Inclusion Commission on the matter and suggested the commission revisit the items periodically, such as every year or two, to review and update them as needed.

Mr. Trudgeon indicated that the Equity and Inclusion Commission has not revisited the items in the last couple of years. He noted that the commission has had a

substantial workload. He explained that the review took place several years ago, when the former Human Rights and Inclusion Commission considered the matter.

Mayor Roe noted that he has asked communications and community engagement staff to keep the proclamations current by reviewing and updating references as needed. He explained that the city had previously spent significant time developing the proclamations and acknowledged that they can become outdated. He added that the proclamations are updated annually.

b. Proclaim Older Adults Month

Mayor Roe read the Older Adults Month Proclamation.

Strahan moved, Groff seconded, proclaiming May 2026 Older Adults Month.

Councilmember Schroeder noted that many of the city's volunteers fall into this group and expressed appreciation for their significant contributions to the community. She added that she frequently hears from group members because they are highly engaged and care deeply about local issues, and she was pleased to see their recognition.

Mayor Roe noted that recognizing older adults in the community also acknowledges the leadership they provide by example for others throughout the community.

c. Proclaim May Mental Health Awareness Month

Mayor Roe read the Mental Health Awareness Month Proclamation.

Groff moved, Schroeder seconded, proclaiming May 2026 Mental Health Awareness Month.

Councilmember Strahan also recognized the many individuals in the community who work each day diligently to support mental health initiatives. She specifically acknowledged those serving on the NAMI board and others involved in related efforts, including individuals connected to Councilmember Groff through his work with NYFS. She noted that many people throughout the community are actively working to improve the mental health and well-being of those who live and work in Roseville.

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Councilmember Groff noted that the city coordinates with NYFS to address mental health needs among youth and their families. He also highlighted the important role of the CAP Teams, recognizing their work in assisting individuals struggling with mental illness and helping connect them with services that meet their needs.

d. Proclaim April 24, 2026, Arbor Day

Mayor Roe read the Arbor Day Proclamation.

Schroeder moved, Bauer seconded, proclaiming April 24, 2026, Arbor Day.

Councilmember Schroeder expressed appreciation for the city's ongoing efforts to maintain healthy trees throughout the community and for prioritizing tree-related initiatives, including the annual tree sale. She noted that the city's commitment to urban forestry is important to the community not only on Arbor Day, but throughout the entire year.

Councilmember Strahan reiterated that the city supports Arbor Day through year-round actions, including its tree sales, ongoing emerald ash borer remediation efforts, grant applications, and its partnership with Tree Trust. She noted that the 2026 tree sale has already sold out, demonstrating continued community interest in obtaining trees through the program.

Councilmember Strahan commented that the city's strong participation and staff dedication show the Arbor Day proclamation reflects active, ongoing work rather than simply symbolic words.


